

The Mullens and Maydwell Trophies

The Mullens and Maydwell trophies have been awarded since 1977 to what are considered to be the best Detachments in Surrey Army Cadet Force.

The following events and activities are those used in making this assessment with the scoring system as shown.

The Mullens Trophy is awarded to the best Detachment, with the Maydwell Trophy going to the runner-up. In addition to receiving the trophy a cash prize is awarded to the winners which is funded through the Surrey Army Cadet Force Association (SACFA).

1. APC Assessment

Each cadet passing 'Mater Cadet' in the year	8 points
Each cadet passing 4 Star in the year	6 points
Each cadet passing 3 Star in the year	4 points
Each cadet passing 2 Star in the year	2 points
Each cadet passing 1 Star in the year	1 point

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

2. Age Structure and Detachment Strength

Each cadet 16 years of age or older as at 31 st March earns	5 points
Each cadet under 16 years of age as at 31 st March earns	3 points

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

3. Annual Inspections

Final inspection grade awarded by the AFC

Above standard	10 points
Up to standard	3 points
Below standard	0 points

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

4. Recruiting

Detachments increasing their strength between 1st April and 31st March will be awarded 1 point for every cadet in excess of their strength at the previous 31st March.

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

5. Attendance at Annual Camp

Number attending Annual Camp (or an approved military course in lieu of):

For each cadet attending	1 point
For every 5% of the strength of the Detachment attending	1 point

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

6. Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme

Points will be awarded both for participation in the scheme and passes, as follows:-

For each cadet participating	1 point
For each Bronze Award	2 points
For each Silver Award	4 points
For each Gold Award	6 points

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

7. BTEC Awards and Participation

Points will be awarded both for participation in the award and for passes, as follows:-

For each cadet participating	1 point
For each BTEC award	3 points

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

8. Surrey ACF Military Skills Competition (when held)

The winning Detachment will be awarded 15 points. The Detachment placed second will be awarded 14 points and so forth.

9. Small bore shooting

The winning Detachment will be awarded 15 points. The Detachment placed second will be awarded 14 points and so forth.

10. County Rifle Meeting

The winning Detachment will be awarded 15 points. The Detachment placed second will be awarded 14 points and so forth.

11. Orienteering

1 point will be awarded for every black, colour or metal award gained during the year.

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

12. Sport Participation

1 point will be awarded per cadet for participation in ACFA organised sports events (regardless of level).

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

13. County Colours

1 point will be awarded per cadet for every award of County Colours.

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

14. Course Attendance

1 point will be awarded per cadet, officer or adult instructor on any recognised military and adventure training course,

All points are added together and the Detachment with the highest number of points is awarded 15 points. The Detachment with the second highest number of points is awarded 14 points and so forth.

15. Achievements and Image in the Community

A discretionary award may be awarded by a panel, created by the Commandant, of up to 15 points for extra achievements (e.g. providing support in the community to any charity events, old comrades' functions, etc.) not otherwise recognised by the scoring system above.

Detachment Commanders should submit a note to the Deputy Commandant of any achievements that they wish to be considered.
